Degree Requirements:

1. Must complete forty-two (42) credits in the major.
2. Before enrolling in INTL 488, must successfully complete INTL 201 with C- or better, complete one language course, and must have at least 75 total credits and at least 24 credits in INTL.
3. Each course in the INTL major can only satisfy one major requirement. Courses cannot double count for major requirements.
4. Students are strongly encouraged to study abroad after their fourth semester at the university.
5. Study abroad and foreign internship experiences may be counted towards the major with the approval of the Coordinator.
