MU ID: GET MOBILE APP

- GET Mobile is the Millersville University ID app and is available to all students and staff. This app will allow you to create a MU Mobile ID.
- MU Mobile ID does not require the creation of a physical ID card. You can access all the same services as a physical ID card, but from your mobile device or smart phone.





MU ID: ALTERNATE OPTION

- If you do not own a smartphone or do not wish to use MU Mobile ID, you must obtain a physical ID card. Please note: you may only have one valid ID.


- Dining options:

PARKING

- All vehicles on campus are expected to have either a decal or a hang tag.
- Three decal options available:
 - 1. Semester commuter decal (White Spots) \$68
 - 2. Annual commuter decal (White Spots) \$100
 - 3. Annual restricted decal (Parking Garage) \$70
- Option 3 only permits you to park in the west side parking garage (corner of Prince & Cottage).
- Register for and purchase your decal through your myVille or MAX account.
- Parking is unmonitored on campus after 4 p.m. and all day on weekends.
- The first week of classes is a grace period for all drivers.
- If you need to drive an alternate vehicle, pick up or print out online a temporary hang tag at University Police.






YOUR MU ACCOUNTS



Marauder email, computer labs, printing and wireless networks, bill payments.




An integrated learning platform for instructors and students to interact with classwork.


ALERTS AND NOTIFICATIONS

MU|ALERT

- Sign up for the Millersville University <u>Emergency Alert System</u>.
- This system will ensure that you are notified of any emergency occurring on campus as well as weather closings and delays. Family members may also sign up for these alerts.

LIVESAFE

- <u>LiveSafe</u> is a mobile safety system.
- Report concerns, monitor your friends walking from class to class, etc.
- LiveSafe is free for students, parents, faculty, and staff.






OTHER SERVICES

- Learning Services
 - If you have a documented learning disability and require support services for your MU class, you must register with this office and provide proper documentation. 717-871-5554
- Exploratory Studies and Student Development
 - The Department will help you consider your college matriculation at MU via the coordination of coursework while still in high school, clarification of MU majors and minors, and serving as a liaison between you and your future department.

 Police for assistance.










You will be connected to the University Store website

High School vs. College - Work

High School

- Directed: Your time is structured by others.
- You are told what to do.
- You seldom need to read anything more than once, and often listening in class is enough.
- You will usually be told in class what you need to learn from the assigned readings.

College

- Ownership: You manage your own time.
- You are expected to take responsibility for what you do and do not do, choices/decisions have consequences.
- You need to review class notes and textbook material regularly.
- It is up to you to read and understand the assigned material; lectures and assignments proceed from the assumption that you've already done so.

High School vs. College - Teachers

High School

- Teachers approach you if they believe you need assistance.
- Teachers often check your homework.
- Teachers often write information on the board to be copied in your notes.
- High school is a teaching environment, in which you acquire facts and skills.

College

- Professors expect you to initiate contact if you need it.
- Professors may not always check for completed homework, but they presume you can perform the same tasks on a test.
- Professors may lecture nonstop and expect you to identify the important points in your notes.
- College is a learning environment, in which you take responsibility for thinking and applying what you have learned.



DUAL ENROLLMENT STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO:

- Handle all communication themselves. Once you become a dual enrollment student, <u>you become a</u> <u>college student</u>. All correspondence will be with the student or high school guidance counselor/school related official.
- Have social and emotional maturity. Often you will be in classes with a wide range of students. Dual enrollment students will need to have the ability to handle the college environment which may be more challenging (ideals, values, etc.) than the high school classroom.
- Identify if you are having an issue with your course, instructor, assignments, etc. You must be able to handle the issue and communicate it appropriately. Know how to advocate for yourself.





DROPPING AND WITHDRAWING

- Add/Drop: (Jan. 21-Jan. 28)
 - Student removes self before drop deadline, which is usually the first week.
 - Course is not on the transcript.
 - No grade designated.
 - Not counted as an attempt.
- Withdrawal: (Jan. April 4)
 - Student removes self after add/drop deadline
 - Course is listed on the transcript.
 - Grade of "W" is recorded.
 - Counted as an attempt.
 - Submits withdrawal form by the tenth week of classes.



TRANSFERABILITY OF DE COURSES

- College credits earned at Millersville University will follow you!
- If you later apply at MU, those credits will be a part of your official transcript.
- If you do not attend Millersville University, the application of transfer credit to general education, prerequisite, and degree programs will vary at any other institution you might attend.
- There is no difference in credit transfer policies for students who take college coursework as regularly admitted college students versus dual enrollment students.



GRADES AND TRANSCRIPTS

- You may access grades for completed classes through your MAX account.
- For your grades to be released by mail to the school district, you must complete, sign and return the Transcript Request Form (a new form each semester).
- In person requests <u>must be made by the</u> <u>student whose record is being requested</u> and photo ID is required to verify identity.
- The Registrar's Office is not able to provide official transcripts electronically currently.





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
