Post-Master's Advanced Children, Youth and Families Certificate



The Advanced Children, Youth and Families Certificate is for students enrolled in or who have completed a master's degree in social work. The purpose of this post-master's certificate program is to prepare students with skills in providing culturally competent services to vulnerable children and families through a range of public and private agencies at various levels of practice.

The focused curriculum includes coursework on clinical skills to work effectively with children and their families to promote positive outcomes, and macro skills and strategies to develop productive change in service delivery systems.

Students receive instruction in evidence-based practice and management strategies to develop competency in working with children and youth in a variety of contexts. Students complete 15 credits leading to the Advanced Children, Youth and Families Certificate.
